The First Reading: Acts 2:42-47

The Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:19–25

Brothers and sisters: It is a credit to you if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, what credit is that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps. "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls. Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church. **Thanks be to God!**

Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord: I know my own and my own know me. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

The Holy Gospel: John 10: 1–10 Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus said to the Pharisees: "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Sermon

Let us confess our faith as we say,

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We pray for those in positions of authority in the nations of the earth; in our own country for Elizabeth, our Queen, Julie Payette, our Governor General, Justin Trudeau, our Prime Minister, J. Michel Doyon, our Lieutenant Governor, François Legault, our Premier, Bruno Guilbault, our Mayor, and for all MPs, MNAs, and Councillors. We pray that they may govern wisely and for the good of all and especially at this time as they continue to struggle with difficult decisions in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic. That by his power, war and famine may cease through all the world, we pray to the Father. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

We pray for those in need, distress or trouble, especially Jean Johnston, Gerry Bologna, Kate Dowie, Danny Fogarty, Krista Fleming, Clifford & Eileen Hale, Glenn Cartwright, Viola Wilde, Muriel Fleming, Douglas Lake, Marilee Marlin, Debbie Sweeney, Carolyn Maguire and for their families.
